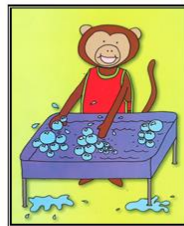

Golden Time happens every week on a Friday, or the last school day of the week on short weeks with INSET days or Bank Holidays. Children may move their name to the Silver or Gold if they are particularly demonstrating the Golden Rules well. Names may be moved to the amber if the Golden Rules are broken, or to the red if the rules continue to be broken. If a child moves their name to red they will lose 5 minutes of Golden Time that week. Everyday names are reset from the amber and red to the green to signify a fresh start.

Star of the Day

Every day we try to nominate a child who has been a 'Star' for that day. This could be because they have made a great effort to follow the Golden Rules, completed a great piece of work, or for putting in effort. Recently these children have been the 'Star of the Day.'
